Tjanpi Desert Weavers are Aboriginal artists from the remote Central and Western desert regions. Tjanpi artists use native grasses, wool, string, seeds and feathers to make spectacular contemporary fibre art, weaving baskets, and sculptures. Explore the



work of these artists and learn about their craft and culture. You will then have the opportunity to design your own creature, sculpt it using the art of armature (wire sculpting) and then bring it to life using weaving, wool, beading and various other materials.

It is very important to me that the students draw and paint from life. We will work in small groups and collaborate on composing a still life - arranging real objects: flowers, fruit, fabrics, bowls and vases into their own compositions.



I will guide you through the lighting and the use of materials. I find that the children gain an enormous sense of autonomy by constructing their 'Still Life' from scratch. Learning to see the perspective as it really is, the negative shapes, tonality...! You will leave with a completed painting on canvas!


The Craft of Writing and Storytelling with Jordan Collins



Jordan Collins was born in the United States, moved to Australia when they were eight.

Growing up, Jordan wanted to be many things: doctor, vet, artist, marine biologist - but stuck with 'author' because of their love of reading. Jordan is African-American-Greek-Australian, which means they have dark skin and curly hair. *Where?* began as a slam poem that Jordan wrote after a lifetime of being asked questions like, 'where are you from?' They first performed the poem at the Poet's Picnic

when they were fourteen. *Where?* has now been transformed into Jordan's debut picture book, illustrated by highly acclaimed artist Phil Leslie. *Where?* is heartfelt picture book that challenges racism from an exciting new voice that is both a cry of pain and a demonstration of inner strength, which takes us on an intergalactic journey past collapsing stars and glowing nebulae to remind us not of our differences but of our shared humanity.





Life Journey Stones are traditional Aboriginal teaching stones. Every symbol has a meaning and these stones are traditionally used to help with a deeper understanding of ourselves within Creation and the Dreaming. Students discover traditional artifacts handmade by Aboriginal Elders and discuss their origins and uses. They then explore how these artifacts are depicted in Aboriginal art along with other iconic symbols and their meanings through the traditional art of dot painting, x-ray art and animal totems. Students will learn about the history of traditional ochre paint, Aboriginal body painting and their meanings of song lines that connect the Aboriginal people and the land. The students will all paint their own journey stones connecting these Aboriginal

symbols to tell their own unique story. Life Journey Stones also make an impactful and memorable sculptural piece within the school grounds.





Always was, Always will be Aboriginal Land




Learning and engaging with Aboriginal culture and community creatively

Through this project we will work with our students to develop a deeper understanding of Aboriginal culture and our First Nations community. This will include developing and filming our own personalised Acknowledgement of Country. A group of senior students will work over several months with artist Rheanna Lotter. Through art, story telling and practical experiences, Rheanna will teach the children about Aboriginal art
