Below is the speech I gave at our festival opening assembly last week:

Thank you Nevada, Joshua, Chloe and Alexander. You've done a great job hosting our festival launch today. A warm welcome goes to our visitors, mums, dads, family, friends, staff and most importantly, our students. I would also like to acknowledge the Gadigal people of the Eora nation. We honour all Aboriginal people whose spirit lies deep within the lands and country we learn on today. As we know, 'Woollahra' is an Aboriginal word for 'meeting place' so it is truly special that all 760 of us meet here every day to learn, sing, dance, create, play sport, share in friendship and become the best we can be. Aboriginal people have been doing these things here for thousands of years. We thank them for the opportunity to be on their land and share in their long established culture of caring and community.



Over the coming weeks we will be enjoying some very special learning across the school with our festival — Connect: A Festival of Creativity and Thinking. With the theme of connection — to self, others and the world, the festival aims to give our children at Woollahra learning opportunities they might not otherwise have. It has a goal of connecting authentically with our whole school community. It is a pleasure to open the festival this morning with this launch. We had a range of fabulous learning experiences last week and I look forward to the many workshops and events we have planned over the next two weeks. The focus will be on creativity, imagination, new ideas, thinking critically and collaboration. Our students will learn and explore alongside their

teachers, work with artists, musicians, writers, scientists and try new things. We are looking forward to enjoying performances from all of our arts ensembles throughout the fortnight and warmly invite parents and friends to the community events we have planned. They include our art exhibition – Express Myself which opens this Thursday displaying a self-portrait done by every student and teacher in the school and the Woollahra Great Debate next Monday night. Make sure you visit the hallway of hope in the main corridor of the Centenary building where you will see 1000 paper cranes symbolising hope and optimism on display. We will look forward to inviting friends and visitors to visit our classrooms to share in our learning and creations as we close the festival on Friday 2 September.

As Woollahra children and as community we are extremely fortunate to have what we have. Children, as we launch our 2022 Festival of Creativity and Thinking, I want you to take a moment to think of at least one thing you are grateful for at school. Keep that thought in your mind throughout the next couple of weeks and focus with gratitude on all that is special and enriching at Woollahra Public School. I also urge you to take every opportunity offered to you, explore, create and connect. My special thanks on behalf of the whole school community also goes to the festival planning team led by Ms Petriella and the many teachers who have contributed to making it all possible. We are deeply appreciative of your efforts.

Buongiorno e benvenuti a tutti! Good day and welcome to another edition of Woollahra Italian News. This year our Italian school program has been keeping everyone busy. It started with Year 3 students trying on the roles of Arlecchino, Pulcinella, Colombina and Dottor Balanzone - the characters of the famous Italian Commedia dell'Arte- as part of their work on Carnevale. The younger students created their own masks.

Year 2 group has learned to name and describe their family members in Italian, uncovering their creativity while creating their *Albero Genealogico* – Family Tree.

This term children have been preparing to present their Italian-English play about cheeky Pinocchio to their Kindergarten siblings, buddies and friends. They have spent much time rehearsing and are very excited to show their talents. We are hopeful for a warm reception, lots of applause and positive comments by the audience.

Our weekly Year 2 and 3 Italian lessons have turned into a room for Italian interactive activities on various Italian vocabulary. The work on Italian worksheets has been enriched by friendly competition in Quizlet and Kahoot educational games. Year 1 are about to follow this trend.

Term 3 timetable has provided Kindergarten students with the opportunity to learn their first Italian words and everyday phrases, which they have been picking up very quickly. They have recently discovered the Italian name for basic shapes and used those shapes to produce their drawings of the world around.

Apart from the Italian program's goal to enhance Woollahra students' interest and knowledge of the Italian language and culture, their natural curiosity has resulted in our

children becoming experts in Roman numerals, Italian and Australian geography and other fields. They have also been improving and strengthening their literacy and numeracy skills acquired at other lessons. # Band Workshop Day – Wednesday 7 September



# Supervision Before and After School

The safety of all of our students is paramount at all times. This includes before and after school. Please be reminded that <u>teacher supervision in the playground starts at 8.30am each morning</u>. No child is permitted to be at school before this time. We have had a number of children arriving at school early and remaining unsupervised in the playground. *Helping Hands* OOSHC Service run an excellent before school care program from 7.00am each morning. We ask that you make use of this service if need be. In the afternoons we ask that all children leave the playground at 3.10pm and do not remain to play unsupervised. Again, there is no teacher supervision after school (that's when we hold our staff, learning support and professional learning meetings). The playground is also used for the aftercare service and it is important children not attending the service leave the grounds. Finally, <u>no child is to play on the playground equipment in the Chisolm and Barton playgrounds before and after school</u>. This rule is in place even when there is a teacher on duty. Please ensure your children stay off the equipment for safety reasons. It can be used during the day when there are fewer children in the playground.
