Year 5 Camp

Earlier this month Year 5 travelled to Sydney Academy of Sport and Recreation Narrabeen for a 3-day camp. Students have reflected on their experience.

Camp was at Narrabeen. The trip was a forty-five-minute drive. When we got to camp, we discussed the rules with Cam and Hugh. After this we were assigned our camp groups and went to our cabin for twenty-five minutes. At eleven, we went to the dining area to have lunch. The groups that we got split into were Gold which was with Ms. Brandon, Jade was with Ms. Hayward, Rainbow was with Ms Costello and Orange was with Ms. Cuthbert. On the first day, Jade and Orange went on a bush walk and cooked damper, while Gold and

Rainbow made chariots and played archery tag.

In kayaking we learnt to paddle, carry the kayak and to put on a life jacket. We played fun and entertaining games on the water such as fruit salad, stuck in the mud, making rafts and invading countries. We also had landmarks to kayak to and from a raft and then listen to the next instruction.

When bushwalking, we were told to collect sticks and leaves. When we got to our location we made the fires and were given our damper to cook. We picked a stick to wrap our damper around and sat down at a fire. We put the damper onto the fire and waited for it to cook. Once the damper had cooked, we pulled it off the stick and put honey inside the



damper.

After we cooked the damper, we went onto a cliff to look out to a nice view of the Narrabeen Lake. On the first night, we played trivia, which lasted till 8.30 pm. Hugh called out the questions and we split up into our trivia groups. Some of the challenges we played were when we had to balance three golf balls on top of each other. We had to rip a paper replica of Australia.

When we did games at night we played lots of little games such as: quickest game of tip; scissor, paper, rock conga line; find the keys; hide and seek and finger fencing. Our favourite games were find the keys and quickest game of tip. We were given a demonstration on how to play all

the games and everyone picked up on how to play the games quickly. It was really fun and we can't wait for camp next year. Archery tag was exciting. We shot each other with a bow that had a foam cube at the end (don't worry, it wasn't

a real bow!) and kept on tagging each other until the music finished. Once the music finished, the instructor changed the rules of the games and we kept on playing until it was time to go back to our cabins. Chariot making was really fun and entertaining. We built child sized cars with wood, nails, wrenches, washers, hammers, ropes, nuts and bolts and loop screws. After building the cars, we raced it around the camp ground. In orienteering we got a coloured route to follow with compass instructions and we had to find letters according to our instructions and when we found all of the letters we had to unscramble them into a famous landmark. This taught



us the skill of teamwork and we got to meet new people. In initiatives we played mini games and challenges. The games included puzzles, towers, maths challenges and teamwork challenges. Mrs Fetherston, Ms Costello, Ms Brandon, Ms Cuthbert and Ms Hayward checked the cabins to see if we were being organised. Points were given out of ten and a winning cabin will be announced.
