COVID 19 Update

Thank you to our whole community for your continued adherence to the COVID 19 safety protocols. While there has been a slight increase in confirmed cases across the school, the case numbers still remain low for the number of children and staff we have in the school. Please read below for some clarification regarding isolation guidelines for household contacts:

If a student or staff member lives with someone who has COVID-19 then they must follow the <u>NSW Health Self Isolation Guidelines External link</u> and self-isolate for 7 days. The student/staff member must also follow the NSW Health Self-Isolation Guidelines for 7 days if they have been notified to do this by NSW Health. A household contact does not need to repeat isolation if another person in their household tests positive in the 14 days after their 7 day isolation period ends.

If another person in their household tests positive for COVID-19 more than 14 days after their 7 day isolation period ends, they will have to isolate again and follow the instructions for household contacts of people with COVID-19.

Learning from Home while Isolating

Thank you to all parents and families for your wonderful cooperation with the isolation guidelines and keeping your children home when they are either sick or are isolating as a household contact. We understand that it's important that children who at home isolating and are well enough or not sick need to continue with their learning. The following is in place for these instances:

- Each class has a 2022 Google Classroom set up in the same way that we did for home learning in 2020-2021. These classrooms are accessed through your child's Department of Education portal account. Please email your class teacher if you are having any problems accessing the account.
- On each Google Classroom we have uploaded the Department of Education's learning from home packages. These have been developed specifically for the situation where children need to isolate. The Department have asked us to use this resource to ensure consistency across schools and to support teachers who are teaching face to face. The packages can also be accessed at this link:

- Students are encouraged to access their Mathletics, Cambridge Hotmaths, Wushka and Reading Eggs accounts from home depending on the digital subscription they have access to.
- Where it is stage appropriate, homework sheets and some other learning activities will be uploaded to our Google Classrooms.
- If you have any questions or need support in accessing the learning materials, please contact your class teacher via their email address or through the school email address.

National Assessment Program Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) 2022

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is a point in time assessment of literacy and numeracy skills. Students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 participate in the annual tests in writing, reading, conventions of language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy. All NSW schools will sit NAPLAN online in 2022.

Our school will be participating in NAPLAN between 10 and 20 May 2022.

In preparation for NAPLAN, our school will also be participating in practice tests for all Year 3 and 5 students this week. The practice test is a trial run and key preparation activity for NAPLAN in May. It is not an assessment of student ability, and the tests will not be marked.


Excessive preparation for NAPLAN is not recommended. Students can use the <u>public demonstration site</u>

(https://www.nap.edu.au/online-assessment/public-demonstration-site) to familiarise themselves with the types of questions and tools available in NAPLAN.

Opportunity Class Applications for 2023 Placement

Opportunity classes cater for intellectually gifted and high potential students who may otherwise be without sufficient classmates at their own academic and social



Testing and assessment

Applications for opportunity class placement are considered on the results of the Opportunity Class Placement Test alone. Students who wish to be considered for opportunity class placement will sit the Opportunity Class Placement Test on Thursday 28 July 2022.



If you would like to have your child considered for Year 5 opportunity class entry in 2023, you need to apply between Tuesday 26 April 2022 and Friday 13 May 2022. You will need to access the online application at: https://education.nsw.gov.au/public-schools/selective-high-schools-and-opportunity-classes/year-5

You must not use the child's email address. Late applications are not usually accepted. If you do not have internet access, you could apply at a public library. If you have a disability that prevents you from using a computer, you can contact the Team for assistance after Tuesday 26 April 2022. You must submit only ONE application for each student.


