


Principal's Message: Ms Nicole Molloy



Rapid Antigen Test Distribution

Thank you for your wonderful support and cooperation in picking up Rapid Antigen Tests (RATs) at the start of the school year and administering them twice weekly over the last fortnight. We are now getting ready to distribute RATs across the school for the next fortnight (14 - 25 February). The same arrangements will be in place as follows:





- If your child has recently tested positive for COVID-19 there is no need to conduct the RAT testing.
- Testing is not mandatory.

Distribution of the Rapid Antigen Tests

For this next fortnight, we will have a couple of options for picking up your RATs as follows:

• RATs can be picked up by parents or caregivers on

Thursday 10 February and Friday 11 February 8.30am – 9.15am and 2.00pm – 3.00pm. This time our RAT distribution table will be just inside Gate 3 near the hall.

- You can request that the RATs be put in your child's bag to bring home which will be done on Friday. We ask that you complete and return the request slip at the bottom of the note sent home this week to the school administration office by Thursday afternoon. Notes can be sent to the office via class teachers or email.
- You can pick up RATs from the school administration office any time next week.

If you do not intend to utilise the RATs we ask that you don't request or pick up your allocation.

Calendar and Dates

We know that everyone has busy lives and for many families you are juggling events and organisation across more than one school. We always include upcoming dates on the front page of the newsletter and will keep the calendar on the home page of our website up to date. You will often hear us talk about what week of the term it is as our school terms are always organised by weeks. We list the week at the top of the newsletter too. To clarify for the term, the Department of Education deemed the week commencing 24 January as Week 1 due to the fact that our staff returned to work on the Friday of that week. Accordingly, the first week that your children attended became Week 2 and this is Week 3. This is slightly confusing which is why it needs clarifying!

This evening is an opportunity to meet your child's class teacher, hear about learning programs they have planned for this year and talk about any organisational details you need to be aware of. Another purpose of the evening is to welcome our new families to the school community and give you the chance to get to know other parents. Unfortunately, due to COVID we will be unable to hold the meetings in person this year so will conduct Zoom meetings. More details including the Zoom links will be sent home next week.

Term 1 Invoices

Once again this term we will be sending home an invoice and note with all of the expenses incurred for your child this term. These notes and invoices will be prepared and sent home next week. We ask that the amount on your term invoice is paid promptly.

Supervision Before and After School

The safety of all of our students is paramount at all times. This includes before and after school. Please be reminded that **teacher supervision in the playground starts at 8.30am each morning**. No child is permitted to be at school before this time unless they are enrolled in a supervised before school activity. We have had a number of children arriving at school early and remaining unsupervised in the playground. Helping Hands run an excellent before school care program in Block E from 7.00am each morning if you need to drop your children early. We ask that you make use of this service if need be. In the afternoons we ask that all children leave the playground at 3.00pm and do not remain to play unsupervised. Helping Hands' after care service runs from 3.00pm until 6.00pm.

Anaphylaxis Reminder – Please ensure NO nuts or nut products are brought to school If your child is diagnosed at risk of a severe allergic reaction, particularly anaphylaxis, the anaphylaxis procedures contains information for schools and parents designed to minimise the risk to students. If your child has an allergy it is Important to let us know.

All families are asked to assist the children in our school who are anaphylactic. This is potentially a life threatening condition. Please do not send any of the following foods for your own children, whilst they are at school:

- Peanuts and other nuts including cashews, hazelnuts, walnuts, pistachios, macadamia, brazil nuts
- Peanut Butter or Nutella
- Muesli bars containing nuts or any other foods containing nuts.

Canteen News from Canteen Fresh

Online ordering is available at Canteen Fresh Woollahra. All Class lists have been updated so please go to www.munchmonitor.com to update or register your child's new class and place an order.

Sushi must be pre ordered the day before by 2.00pm and is not available on Mondays. Snacks and drinks are available for purchase at both breaks and before and after school. There are no over the counter sales for K-2 students. We ask that all orders for these students are done online. Manual lunch orders must be handed in by 8.50am and online orders close at 8.15am. If your child requires meals and snacks for after school activities, these must be picked up at the canteen by 3.15 pm. If your child requires meals and snacks for excursions, these must be pre ordered 24 hours in advance and picked up from the canteen the morning of the excursion. Excursion packs will be available soon.

Fridays are our busiest day. To avoid delays, please order lunches the day before. We have occasionally had system problem overloads. This will avoid orders not being processed because of the very high usage on a Friday morning. It is also a good idea to keep some extra money in your account. Occasionally lunches have been forgotten at home or dropped or the order deadline missed. We can then process the order for you if needed or if your child is still hungry they can come and see us and pick up a snack with your permission.

Special Religious Education and Special Education in Ethics

Special Religious Education (SRE) and Special Education in Ethics lessons are provided every week and are taught by visiting teachers organised through approved religious and ethics providers. These lessons take place on a Tuesday as follows and will commence for the term on 22 February:

- 9.00am 9.30am Students in Years 3 and 4
- 9.30am 10.00am Students in Years 5 and 6
- 10.30am 11.00am Students in Kindergarten, Years 1 and 2

The following options are available to students at these times:

Catholic (Catholic Diocese of Sydney)

The Catholic Church sees the education of Catholic children in the Faith as integral and key to its mission. Catholic SRE Teachers (also referred to as Catechists) are volunteers who are approved, authorised, and trained by the local parish and Dioceses of the Catholic Church. Our volunteers ensure that children attending Catholic SRE classes receive lessons about building a relationship with Jesus and understanding his message of salvation. They also give them background preparation for the Sacraments that may be available to their age group.

Protestant (Anglican Diocese of Sydney and Uniting Church of Australia)

At Woollahra, Protestant Christian Special Religious Education delivers approved programs that explore Christian Scriptures, core Christian beliefs, and examine how the teachings of Jesus call us to make good life choices in our relationships. Teachers utilise a variety of teaching methods that allow students to respond to lessons via writing, group discussion, music and song, drama and prayer. All teachers are people of faith and volunteers from local churches.

Judaism (NSW Board of Jewish Education)

The Board of Jewish Education (BJE) provides a structured curriculum for students in Jewish SRE classes. Students are encouraged to feel positive about being Jewish and to identify with the Jewish community. They learn about Jewish holidays, values, synagogue basics and Israel. Older children also explore ethical aspects of Judaism and explore some areas of Jewish history. Basic Jewish prayers are incorporated into each lesson.

Orthodox (Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of Australia)

Orthodox Special Religious Education is coordinated by the Saint George Church Rose Bay.

Buddhism (Buddhist Council of NSW)

Buddhist Special Religious Education is coordinated by the Buddhist Council of NSW.

Ethics (Primary Ethics)

Ethics is a branch of philosophy that examines ethical concepts and issues, asking what is right or wrong in particular circumstances. The ethics curriculum comprises a wide range of age appropriate topics that primary-aged children find interesting. Students learn to think about ethical matters and engage in the give-and-take of reasoned argument. This process allows them to properly consider other people's points of view and to be sincere, reasonable and respectful in dealing with their differences. The K-6 curriculum has 78 topics, starting with *Questions and Puzzlement*, introducing children to the foundation of ethical thinking. Children in the younger primary years examine issues such as being left out, sharing and bullying, while older children reflect on issues such as homelessness, fairness and teasing to help them consider the feelings and interests of others — one important aspect of moral reasoning. Other aspects include understanding consequences, having empathy and appreciating difference. Research shows that well-reasoned moral judgement does not develop automatically as young people mature and that these skills are best developed using the methods we employ in ethics classes. Once acquired, these skills accompany individuals into adulthood.

Non-SRE Classes

The school offers non-SRE as an option during special religious education classes for children who do not wish to attend any other class. During these times students complete independent reading or study.

Department of Education policy requires the school to send a letter to the family of each student new to the school to ascertain the group you would like your children to join during SRE and SEE time. This letter has been issued to Kindergarten 2022 students plus new OC students and students that have joined us from other schools. If you would like to change your child's group please do so in writing to the school by early next week.

SRE and SEE lessons will commence for Years 1-6 on Tuesday 16 February. This program is coordinated by our Deputy Principal Mrs Warhurst. Please contact your class teacher or Mrs Warhurst if you have questions.
