### Principal's Message: Ms Nicole Molloy

#### Thank you for your support!

Thank you to the many parents for your messages, emails and kind words of support in the playground following my 'Pleading Principal' message earlier in the week. In case you missed it, I've included it here. To add to the reminders in my earlier message, please remember that the 'no parking' signs in Forth Street adjacent to the bus zone mean that you can pull in to drop your child but please do not get out of the car to bring your child into the playground. It's meant to be a quick drop off spot and it's important that you move on quickly so that other parents can use the space. The Woollahra Council rangers were on Forth Street and Osborne Lane today enforcing traffic and parking rules. Remember to abide by these rules for the safety of all.

Those of you who know me well, will know it takes a lot to get me frazzled! It's also not often that I plead on bended knees with my very best pleading look but here we go...

We need the help of EVERYONE in our school community to work together in making sure we are all safe and that the complex nature of moving our 700 young people on and off the school site each day happens in a safe and calm manner. I plead and implore everyone to adhere to the following:

 FORTH STREET BUS ZONE - Please don't park in the bus zones on Forth Street from 2.30pm each day <u>under any circumstances</u>.
 Even if you think you'll be quick it's not ok to park there. Each day for the last week we have had parents parking in this zone.
 This then means the buses can't pull in to pick up our kids and



consequently they block up the Forth St traffic and streets beyond this. Never, ever, ever, ever park there. Please!! We currently have traffic markers out there and myself or my staff are actually patrolling the street but cars still seem to be sneaking in if we're not out there quickly enough. It's been really challenging for the last few weeks so let's work as a community to ensure we never park in bus zones, no stopping zones, no parking zones or the disabled parking spot.

- FORTH STREET SAFETY please do not do a U-turn on any part of Forth Street in the mornings at drop off or in the afternoons at pick up. There are lots of pedestrians around, most of them being children and it's so unsafe. If the street is blocked up, please be patient. It will clear. It's not worth risking an accident or someone's life. Please also make sure you use the pedestrian crossing and don't cross other parts of the road with your child. This is also extremely unsafe and is why we have a pedestrian crossing. Let's use it.
- OSBORNE LANE CAR LINE If you are using car line please be efficient and quick with getting your children into the
  car to ensure it moves quickly. There are always two staff members supervising. As you pull in, move up as far as
  you can so that we are loading three cars at a time. If your child is not waiting at the gate please keep moving and
  go around the block. If the car line doesn't keep moving, this blocks up Osborne Lane and then Edgecliff Road. This
  then blocks up all of the surrounding roads leading to frustration for everyone. The car line must keep moving.
  Please do not pull over on the side of the lane opposite our school fence under any circumstances. Remember that

Gate 4 on Osborne Lane is <u>not a pedestrian exit point</u> in the afternoons for safety reasons. It only takes an extra minute to walk the other way - a minute that could save a life.

DOGS - Most of you will know that I love dogs and will take any opportunity to pat your pooches when I see
them BUT only in a safe manner and it should <u>NEVER</u> be on the school site. For safety reasons, dogs are not allowed
on school sites and can't be tied up at our fences unattended. Even the most friendly, placid dog could react in an
unsafe manner if startled or approached in a way that makes the dog feel uncomfortable. Please keep your
pooches on a lead outside the school grounds and fully supervised by an adult if you are walking them to and from
school.

We are large school community and I am always so proud of the way we work together in the interests of the safety and wellbeing of everyone. We show kindness, care and patience for each other even when things are busy, congested or a little challenging (a good description for pick up some afternoons!). Let's make sure we all live these values and guiding principles every afternoon. I think we might be a little out of practice after such a long period of adjusted COVID routines. I'm confident however that we can get back to the well-oiled, harmonious, cooperative school community that we are. Please remind relatives or friends who might be picking up your children of the guidelines and routines too.

I'm not sure what the stage after 'slightly frazzled, pleading principal' is and I hope I don't have to find out! Is it begging principal?!!! It's not in my nature and I know as a community we can sort things straight away so that I don't have to get to that point. Let's face it, a photo of a 'begging principal' could be even worse than the 'pleading principal' above! Let's avoid having to see that photo!

#### **COVID 19 Update**

Thank you to our whole community for your continued adherence to the COVID 19 safety protocols. While there has been a slight increase in confirmed cases across the school, the case numbers still remain low for the number of children and staff we have in the school. Please read below for some clarification regarding isolation guidelines for household contacts:

If a student or staff member lives with someone who has COVID-19 then they must follow the <u>NSW Health Self Isolation Guidelines External link</u> and self-isolate for 7 days. The student/staff member must also follow the NSW Health Self-Isolation Guidelines for 7 days if they have been notified to do this by NSW Health. A household contact does not need to repeat isolation if another person in their household tests positive in the 14 days after their 7 day isolation period ends.

If another person in their household tests positive for COVID-19 more than 14 days after their 7 day isolation period ends, they will have to isolate again and follow the instructions for household contacts of people with COVID-19.

#### 2022 New South Wales Premier's Reading Challenge

The NSW Premier's Reading Challenge (PRC) for 2022 commenced on Monday 28 February. The Challenge aims to encourage a love of reading in students and to enable them to experience quality literature. It is not a competition but a challenge to each student to read more and read more widely.

The PRC is open to all NSW students from Kindergarten to Year 9 and does not close until Friday 19 August. We encourage all students at Woollahra Public School to participate in the PRC and the library has a wide range of PRC books for students to borrow and enjoy reading.

At Woollahra, K to 2 students have the books read to them in their classroom



and students in Year 2 also read some independently.

Years 3 to 6 students are encouraged to borrow PRC books regularly and read them independently. Students then record them on their personal log sheet. Before the closing date, in Term 3, we have sessions in the library and classroom to read and to record them on the PRC personal site page. Students in K-2 must have heard or read 30 PRC Books (25 PRC books and 5 free choice) and Years 3-6 students need to read 20 books (15 PRC books and 5 free choice).

The library has many new books and we would appreciate parent helpers to assist in covering them. Please contact me on kellie.hoare@det.nsw.edu.au if you would like to assist with covering books. Parents can take home a bag of books and contact to cover books in your own time and these can be collected from the library.
