Our festival event promises to engage the whole school community in a range of unique learning experiences, events and shared performances by our students, teachers and community members from Monday 15 August until Friday 2 September. Over the course of the three-week event, a range of teacher led and expert community led workshops will be offered to all of our students. Community expert led workshops will provide unique learning

Nationally Consistent Collection of Data

All schools in Australia participate in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD) each year. The process requires schools to identify information already available in the school about supports provided to students with disability. These relate to legislative requirements under the Disability Discrimination Act 1992 and the Disability Standards for Education 2005, in line with the NCCD guidelines (2019). All students who receive additional support at school are included in this process. The data is provided in such a way that no individual student will be able to be identified – the privacy and confidentiality of all students is ensured. 6P have been working on a Mathematical and Statistical Challenge run by Melbourne University. The purpose of this competition is to extend our knowledge beyond the original questions. Our class has had masses of fun working cooperatively and deciphering the questions beyond the surface level by increasing the complexity.

We have been working on a statistical question that expands on the


topic of CO2 Emission Indicators in Australia.

With the aid of these indicators, nations like Australia can better predict how much CO2 emissions they will produce over the course of a given time and prevent the recurrence of high greenhouse gas concentrations. Children in Australia are now being assisted by these indicators to comprehend the issues with greenhouse gases. These indicators include, but are not limited to Economic Policy and Debt, Infrastructure, Trade, Education, and many more. Working through the question has



The growing prices of vegetables and gasoline have made headlines in recurrent months, with hings prices generating significant rises in Australia's cost of living. In this maths competition, we were challenged to evaluate numerous



problems with a partner of choice. We chose an intermediate level question on probability. The question we decided to evaluate was quite difficult. The genre of the question was probability, a genre we weren't completely familiar with. Although we ran into many

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difficulties along the way, we were able to complete the questions we were assigned and took the question to a deeper level. All in all, this

competition has been a great learning experience and we both really enjoyed it. We are very appreciative of our teacher for guiding our paths to the future.



Fei and Ching Ching

For the mathematics competition, our question was primarily based on rates and inscriptions. We were provided with two diagrams-one of a square-circle combination and the other of a triangle-circle combination. Our task was to find the rate at which the radius/side length of the



shapes declined. There were also extension questions, one of the most difficult

being the 3D version of the square-circle question (finding the volume of a sphere inscribed into a cube). Although we had to answer the questions themselves, the main task of the mathematics and statistics challenge was to extend beyond the scope of the question. One example of this in the series of questions was finding a correlation between square-circle combinations and other polygon inscriptions.

Sophia

In the Mathematics and Statistics Competition, I worked on a formal report about question 6: Pythagorean theorem/triples. For a brief explanation, question six was a collection of research topics that all had something to do with Pythagoras's theory. Within this area, most of the questions (which consisted of approximately 8) made me judge and extend my research. The topics involved included statistics, ratios, and angles. I learned about triangles and what makes them efficient, along with the proportions and formations of each line. Quite a bit of the information needed to be thought about for nearly an hour before I understood. However, in the grand scheme of things, it was a great experience and taught me a lot.

Mathis and Toby

For the maths competition we chose to go with the free choice question in the Junior booklet which had to do with shapes and patterns. We chose Finding Patterns in DNA. How it works, to put it briefly, is that scientists try to find repeats in patterns of four nucleotides: Adenine (A), Thymine (T), Guanine (G), and Cytosine (C). We found that DNA is easy to extract but hard to investigate in terms of the patterns. Overall, we have found this exercise fun and challenging. We have learnt a lot and we cannot wait to complete the challenge.



Learning in 6MG with Mrs Melville-Griffiths

6MG have been exploring a variety of art styles to construct faces. Humans are biologically programmed to be drawn to

faces and connect with them. Consequently, everyone loves a good portrait. We love to draw them, look at them and wonder about the person in it. It is part of our survival to live in small, sociable communities and be able to read each other's facial expressions. 6MG have learnt about shape, value, line and space, through drawing faces.

Please be aware, school staff/parents are not authorised to carry out the duties of the SCS and must not use the STOP Children Crossing bat and/or the Transport for NSW uniform. The school may wish to place Children's Crossing flags out at the crossing (if applicable) and organise a school staff member to monitor the crossing and remind the students of the road safety messages which are:

- Wherever possible, cross the road at a designated pedestrian crossing facility
- Stop! Look! Listen! Think! when crossing the road
- Take care whenever you cross
- Don't run across the road
