# Dogs on our School Site

For many members of our school community, dogs are an important part of our lives. We do have to remember however, that this is not the case for all of our students and their families. We have some students that are quite fearful of dogs. In addition, even the most placid dog can be unpredictable in an environment such as a school playground or on the streets around the school. We have recently had a number of incidents where dogs have been brought onto the school grounds. This has caused a

great deal of distress and fear for some of our children.

- Please remember that dogs are not to be brought onto our school site at any time leashed or unleashed.
- They are also not to be tied up outside the school grounds at any time.
- If walking your dog to school for pick up, please DO NOT wait at Gate 3 (near the hall) as this is the main exit point for our younger children.

# A reminder that this is law under the NSW Companion Animals Act as follows:

Dogs are prohibited in the following places (whether or not they are leashed or otherwise controlled)--

- (a) Children's play areas (meaning any public place, or part of a public place that is within 10 metres of any playing apparatus provided in that public place or part for the use of children).
- (e) School grounds (meaning any property occupied or used for a purpose connected with the conduct of a government school or non- government school under the <u>Education Act 1990</u>, other than any property used for a residence or the curtilage of a residence).

While only a small percentage of dogs will ever be involved in an attack, the <u>Companion Animals Act 1998</u> ('the Act') requires that all dogs must be under effective control by means of a chain, cord or leash when in public (unless in a designated off-leash area) in order to minimise the chances of an attack occurring, and to protect the welfare of the dog and members of the public. (Ref: Woollahra Council website).

While it is imperative that we all abide by the law, it's just as important that we support each other as a community. Our school grounds need to be a safe place for every child and family. This means it is not a place for dogs.

## **Osborne Lane Pick Up**

As we all know, our school is a busy place at 3.00pm in the afternoon at pick up time. We all need to work as a team to ensure children are picked up safely and efficiently. We also need to ensure we are being respectful and kind to local residents. We've recently had some unacceptable incidents in Osborne Lane with community members speaking in an unkind and disrespectful manner to both staff and local residents. As you would agree, this is unacceptable and not in keeping with our school values of kindness and respect. The following guidelines for pick up in Osbourne Lane are important and I seek everyone's assistance in adhering to them.

- Osborne Lane is a **no parking and no standing area**. Please do not arrive early and park in the lane or pull over <u>under any circumstances</u>. This is unsafe and also blocks access to the garages of residents.
- Please do not enter the Osborne Lane for pick up prior to 3.00pm. If your child is not waiting at the gate when you arrive, you will need to move on a go around the block to ensure traffic is not blocked. If the car line doesn't keep moving, this blocks up Osborne Lane and then Edgecliff Road. This then blocks up all of the surrounding roads leading to frustration for everyone.
- ABSOLUTELY
  NO PARKING
  STANDING
  STOPPING
  AT ANY TIME
- We are putting some strategies in place this term to ensure children are at the back gate in timely manner to ease this frustration.
- If you are using car line please be efficient and quick with getting your children into the car to ensure it moves quickly.

  As you pull in, move up as far as you can so that we are loading three cars at a time.
- Remember that Gate 4 on Osborne Lane is <u>not a pedestrian exit point</u> in the afternoons for safety reasons. It only takes an extra minute to walk the other way a minute that could save a life.

Selective high schools help these students to learn by grouping them with students of similar ability, and by using specialised teaching methods.


If you would like to have your child considered for Year 7 selective high school entry in 2024, you need to apply on the internet using a valid email address (not the student's email address).

# The Selective High School Placement Test will be held on Thursday 9 May 2024.


