Semester 2 Reports

The semester 2 student reports were made available online through the SENTRAL parent portal this week. Teachers have worked hard to put together comprehensive reports outlining your child's progress and areas for further development. The report has been put together with careful consideration of your child's performance, effort and progress throughout the semester. Progress judgements have been made by teachers based on work samples, formal assessments, observation, daily classwork and conversations with your child. It has been wonderful to read about the gains all of our students have made and the high levels of effort they have put into achieving their learning goals. The report format has been designed to outline the program of study your child has undertaken in each learning area and assess their level of achievement against expected achievement standards. It is never possible to capture every aspect of your child's learning in one document and I encourage you to talk to your child's teacher and look at examples of their work for more detail. As in Semester 1, the assessment of achievement which is done on a five-point scale uses the following levels – Working Beyond, Working Above, Expected Level, Working Towards and Individual Program. I ask that you read the descriptors for each level carefully in order to interpret your child's report. We hope you find your child's report informative and that it is a positive experience sharing in their achievements and looking at their future learning goals. The student reflections are thoughtful and insightful. If you have any problems accessing your child's report through SENTRAL please don't hesitate to contact us via the school email address.

2024 Class Formation

As we will need to wait until the beginning of the 2024 school year to finalise enrolments and staffing, students will return to their 2023 classes on Thursday 1 February for a couple of days. I anticipate we will be ready to form classes by Tuesday 6 February, following the enrolment of our new Kindergarten students on Monday 5 February. While I appreciate children and parents are excited to join their new teacher and class as soon as possible, it is far better to wait a couple of days rather than settle children into classes and then have to make changes if our student numbers alter. At this stage, our student enrolment numbers are extremely variable meaning we will need to wait until the first week back in 2024 to confirm numbers, staffing and classes. I appreciate your patience and understanding with this matter.

2024 Enrolments

We are currently in the process of finalising our staffing and classes for 2024. At this stage we are waiting on some new families to confirm that their children will be attending Woollahra and as a result I am unable to finalise our class structures and staffing entitlements. Families can assist me in this process by:

- Informing us if you are moving out of the area and your child will not be returning to Woollahra in 2024.
- Ensuring we have notification in writing if your child will be returning late at the beginning of the 2024 school year so that we can hold a place for them. Most families have provided this information via the enrolment intentions forms. If your circumstances change, please inform the school office.



2024 Department of Education Calendar

Accompanying today's newsletter is the 2023 Department of Education calendar. This calendar details the school term dates, school holidays and school development days for 2024.

School Development Days – End of Year and 2024

Parents will be aware that schools have school development days on the first days of Terms 1, 2 and 3 and the last day of Term 4. These days are non-teaching days and focus on teacher professional learning and school planning.

- The school development days scheduled for the end of this year are Monday 18 December and Tuesday 19 December. Staff will be at work on Monday 18 December for a professional learning and planning day. This will be a student-free day. Tuesday 19 December was re-scheduled this year with teachers completing their professional learning workshops during evening sessions. Accordingly, there will be no staff present on Tuesday 19 December and the school will be closed to students. The last day of attendance for students is Friday 15 December.

- New Kindergarten students will complete their Best Start Assessments on Thursday 1 and Friday 2 February. Their first day of school will be Monday 5 February 2024.

Arts at Woollahra - Join our Musical Ensembles in 2024





Stage 1 News

Being Excited About Reading Program

In 2020, we launched a successful reading program called Being Excited About Reading (BEAR Program). The BEAR Program is designed to strengthen and increase Year 1 students' reading fluency, phonological awareness, phonic knowledge, vocabulary, comprehension and LOVE of reading.

Previously, the program was run by school staff. This year, the students and teachers have thoroughly enjoyed working closely with 16 amazing and dedicated community-based volunteers — our special BEAR tutors. Volunteers were trained by school staff in a workshop on how to deliver the BEAR session, which included useful strategies to support and extend students' reading skills. Students worked with their BEAR tutor at least twice a week to strengthen their reading skills and love of reading. The program has been extremely successful, with our 26 students having their graduating ceremony recently! Thank you 'Beary' much from the bottom of our 'beary' big hearts to our BEAR tutors,





What is the BEAR Program?

The BEAR program is when you read with a grown-up, who already knows how to read! They read it first then I know what to do when I read. It means Be Excited about Reading and guess what, I am excited about reading now! (Marli, 1BH)

I ALSO really love reading! And I have become even more excited since BEAR. (Harvey, 1BH)

You meet a new parent and then get a sticker at the end for being persistent with your reading (Marli, 1BH)

I do it because I love reading, not for the sticker. My tutor listens to me read and helps if I make a mistake. And the best part is that I met a cool granny as my teacher! (Harvey, 1BH)



What is the best part of the program?

It's very good because at the end you play games, and the books are interesting to read. It's basically a reading program with a BEAR adult. (Hudson 10 and Hunter1BH)

It helped me by teaching me to read in a fun way and learn more hard words and sound out each word. I loved reading all the stories. I think all the children should do it. (Jack, 1BH)

It helped me skills to read in a better way and how to figure out new words. (Abi, 2K)

I like my tutor so much; I wait every week for BEAR. She is so kind and patient and funny and so nice to me. I am proud of all my reading and how much I have improved. (Finn, 1/2R)

I like reading now and at the end you get a graduation ceremony with your BEAR friends and tutors! (Ela, 1SK)

2024 Travel Applications Now Open

Students who need a School Opal card or travel pass for 2024 can apply here. A new application will need to be submitted if they are applying for the first time, or if they are requesting additional travel entitlement because of new shared parental arrangement (e.g., joint custody).



Students who change address, school, campus location, have repeated a year or received an expiry notification from Transport for NSW for their school travel entitlement should <u>renew or update</u> their details before **the end of Term 4**. This will ensure that schools can endorse applications, and entitlements remain valid for the start of the 2024 school year. School Opal card holders will have the changes applied to their existing card.

Students in the Opal network applying for an Opal card (including a Term Bus Pass) for the first time will receive their Student Opal card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out from January 2024.


