School Development Days – End of Year and 2024

Learning Japanese with Mr Lawson

This term in Japanese, we have been growing our knowledge of fundamental sentence structure through the study of adjectives and their proper application in conjunction with nouns. Additionally, we have honed our listening abilities with videos of native Japanese speakers, breaking their conversations down into smaller parts, then deconstructing the grammar points in their speech. We have also continued the revision of both reading and writing hiragana script to improve our proficiency.

In addition to learning more about Japanese language, we have also looked at various interesting and unique places in Japan which are of cultural significance as well as popular tourist attractions. We learned to use Google Earth to navigate Japan and create personal maps of places which are of interest to us. This week, as well as preparing for our Japanese assessment through revision of previously learned content, we have also been introduced into the world of *shodo* – the art of Japanese calligraphy.

Year 6 Head to Canberra!



Year 6 have recently spent 3 days and two nights in Canberra. The students had a busy few days visiting many important places. Here are a few highlights of our trip.

Parliament House was a highlight of my Canberra experience because it felt like a really big deal to stand in the house of one of the most important people in the country and to actually look at the car where Prince Charles (now King Charles III) sat. My favourite part (surprisingly) was the giant cabinet in the Government house. With 52 drawers, it was made by Geoffrey Hannah, and it may not sound like much, but it is quite the sight to see. Something else that I really liked was the number



plate of the Governor General's car, which is simply a red and gold crown. **Tino 6M**

At the **Australian Electoral Commission**, we learnt how the Australian voting system works. We did a mock election with four candidates, orange, banana, peach, and apple. We received a slip of paper with each of the candidates. We had to vote by numbering them from our favourite - number 1 to our least favourite - number 4. Then we put our votes into the ballot box and after everyone voted we counted the score:

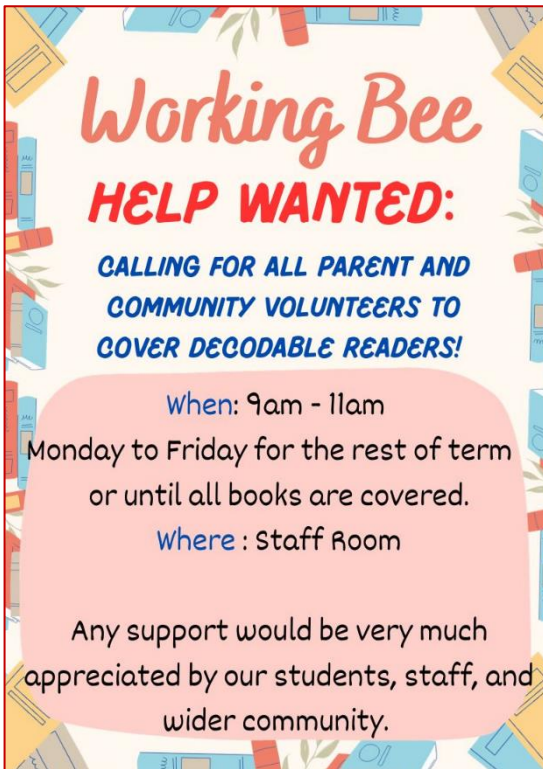
In the lead: peach! Second: banana; third: orange and in last place: apple

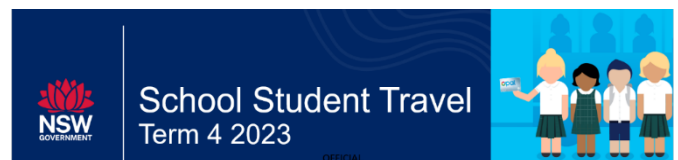
Stage 3 News

2024 Travel Applications Now Open

Students who need a School Opal card or travel pass for 2024 can apply [here](#). A new application will need to be submitted if they are applying for the first time, or if they are requesting additional travel entitlement because of new shared parental arrangement (e.g., joint custody).

Students who change address, school, campus location, have repeated a year or received an expiry notification from Transport for NSW for their school travel entitlement should [renew or update](#) their details before **the end of Term 4**. This will ensure that schools can endorse applications, and entitlements remain valid for the start of the 2024 school year. School Opal card holders will have the changes applied to their existing card.

Students in the Opal network applying for an Opal card (including a Term Bus Pass) for the first time will receive their Student Opal card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out from January 2024.

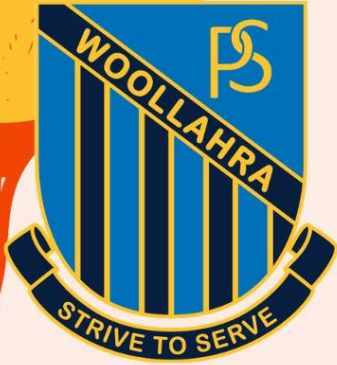
