## Our Student Leaders and new Kindergarten families

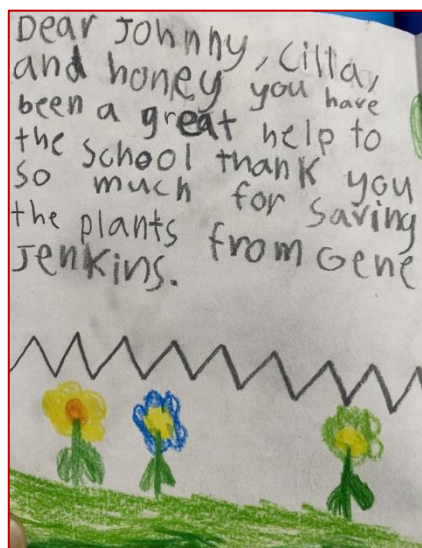

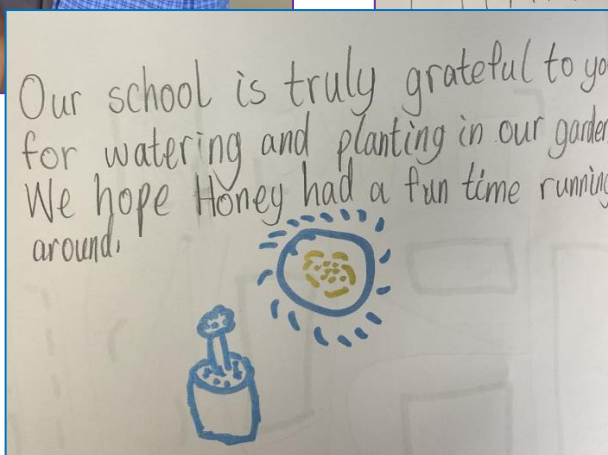
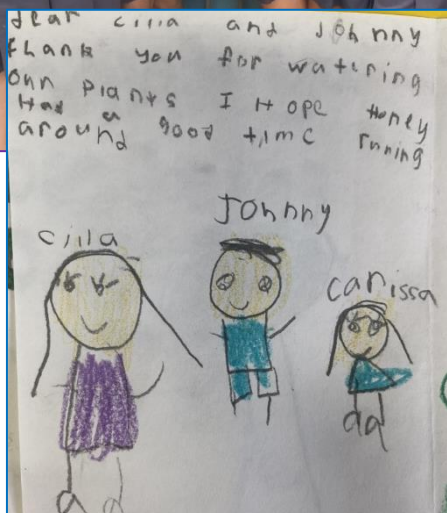
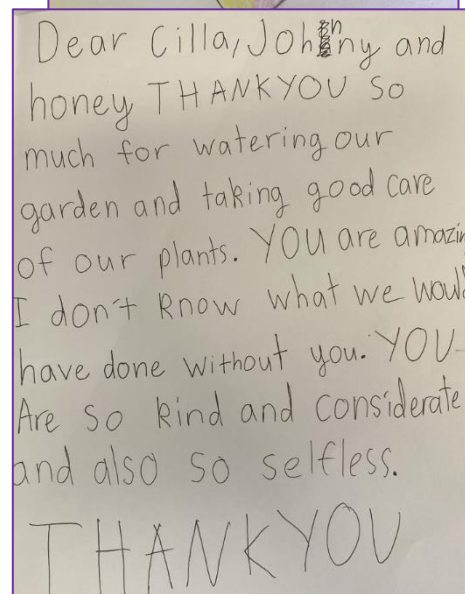
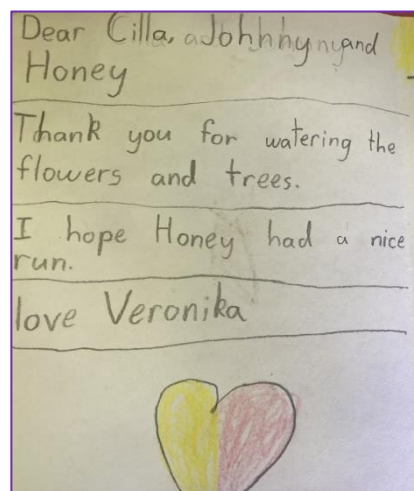






### Thank you to our amazing neighbours Cilla, Johnny and Toffee

### Parent Information Evenings

This evening is an opportunity to meet your child's class teacher, hear about learning programs they have planned for this year and talk about any organisational details you need to be aware of. Another purpose of the evening is to welcome our new families to the school community and give you the chance to get to know other parents.

### Term 1 Invoices and Moving to a new System

Once again this term we will be sending home an invoice and note with all of the expenses incurred for your child this term. These notes and invoices will be prepared and sent home next week. We ask that the amount on your term invoice is paid promptly. From next term we will be moving to a new online platform that will allow you to pay all of your accounts easily online as well as sign permission notes digitally. This will make things far more efficient and easier for all families. We will look forward to provide more information soon as we transition to the new system.

### Supervision Before and After School

The safety of all of our students is paramount at all times. This includes before and after school. Please be reminded that **teacher supervision in the playground starts at 8.30am each morning**. No child is permitted to be at school before this time unless they are enrolled in a supervised before school activity. We have had a number of children arriving at school early and remaining unsupervised in the playground. Helping Hands run an excellent before school care program in Block E from 7.00am each morning if you need to drop your children early. We ask that you make use of this service if need be. In the afternoons we ask that all children leave the playground at 3.00pm and do not remain to play unsupervised. Helping Hands' after care service runs from 3.00pm until 6.00pm.

### Anaphylaxis Reminder – Please ensure NO nuts or nut products are brought to school

If your child is diagnosed at risk of a severe allergic reaction, particularly anaphylaxis, the anaphylaxis procedures contains information for schools and parents designed to minimise the risk to students. If your child has an allergy it is important to let us know.

All families are asked to assist the children in our school who are anaphylactic. This is potentially a life threatening condition. Please do not send any of the following foods for your own children, whilst they are at school:

- Peanuts and other nuts including cashews, hazelnuts, walnuts, pistachios, macadamia, brazil nuts
- Peanut Butter or Nutella
- Muesli bars containing nuts or any other foods containing nuts.



## Canteen News from Canteen Fresh

Online ordering is available at Canteen Fresh Woollahra. All Class lists have been updated so please go to [www.munchmonitor.com](http://www.munchmonitor.com) to update or register your child's new class and place an order.

Sushi must be pre ordered the day before by 2.00pm and is not available on Mondays. Snacks and drinks are available for purchase at both breaks and before school. There are no over the counter sales for K-2 students. We ask that all orders for these students are done online. Manual lunch orders must be handed in by 8.50am and online orders close at 8.15am. If your child requires meals and snacks for excursions, these must be pre-ordered 24 hours in advance and picked up from the canteen the morning of the excursion.

Fridays are our busiest day. To avoid delays, please order lunches the day before. We have occasionally had system problem overloads. This will avoid orders not being processed because of the very high usage on a Friday morning. It is also a good idea to keep some extra money in your account. Occasionally lunches have been forgotten at home or dropped or the order deadline missed. We can then process the order for you if needed or if your child is still hungry they can come and see us and pick up a snack with your permission.

The aim of our program will be to ensure choir sessions are engaging and interesting as well as providing students with the musical training required to be a member of this type of ensemble. The choir is open to all students regardless of ability – enthusiasm and motivation will be enough!. For many rehearsals and performances we will work together as one whole ‘Super Choir’. For some performances we will divide into Junior and Senior choir. Our performance program will be planned so that it gives the students a range of opportunities to perform both at school functions and in the wider community. Later in the year children in Years 3-6 will have the opportunity to perform as part of a massed choir at the Sydney Opera House and Town Hall.

**Students who make a commitment to the choir need to be aware that they do so for the entire year.** It is disruptive to the ensembles if members are coming in and out at different times in the year. Each child will need a plastic display folder for their music and it will be important that they bring this along to every rehearsal.
