

Positive Behaviour for Learning

Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) is a framework that helps WPS develop a positive, safe and supportive culture. Expectations are consistent and explicit across the school, giving teachers and students more time to focus on relationships and classroom instruction. This week our PBL focus is the **Playground**. Teachers will be reminding students how to play fairly and safely, how to look after our school equipment and how to deal with any playground issues. These explicit discussions will include:

- Play fairly, take turns and include others
- Put rubbish in bin
- Use appropriate language
- Share playground space
- Wear your school hat
- Use play equipment correctly and stay in the supervised areas
- No riding bikes or scooters
- Only enter classrooms if a teacher is present
- Follow rules of approved games
- Follow sports roster
- Try new games and make new friends
- Go to class quickly after the bell

At all times we are reminding students of our three expectations at Woollahra Public School:

- Be Respectful
- Be Safe
- Be an Active Learner.

At all times we are encouraging students to follow our three school expectations of being respectful, safe and an active learner. Thank you for your support of PBL by going through these expectations with your children.
