Thank you to the parents who have already completed these online forms. They are quick to complete and we would appreciate every family completing them as soon as possible. This will give us adequate time to process the forms and contact families if any clarification is needed. Please note, that every family needs to complete one of the forms even if you don't require placement in a NSW government high school.

#### Cultures of Thinking – Philosophy at Woollahra

An important goal for us at Woollahra is to foster a strong culture of thinking across the school. This can be done in so many ways, one of them being the teaching of Philosophy K-6. We are always striving to improve our knowledge and skills for this program. I had the pleasure of attending a two day professional learning course over the last couple of weekends along with Bec Isaacs. We worked with facilitators from the Association for Philosophy in Schools NSW. The goal was to build our skills as teachers of philosophy and also reflect on how we lead the program in our school. We connected with educators from primary and high schools and came away inspired and invigorated about what is possible in teaching philosophy to your children and embedding a culture of deep thinking in our school community. We will share more of this work as we go along and plan to run a parent workshop on the topic next term. 
## Philosophy at Woollahra with Miss Isaacs

Meanwhile, Ms Molloy and I have spent the past two Saturdays at a *Philosophy for Children* workshop run by The Association for Philosophy in Schools New South Wales. ## **Back To School Vouchers**

#### **Communication – Sentral Platform**

There are a couple of different communication platforms we use to communicate between school and home. The Sentral Parent portal provides parents with access to your child's school reports. It does have other functionality which we will increasingly use but at the moment we primarily use it for your access to reports. Our Sentral coordinating team will work over the next couple of weeks to provide access keys and information for new families to access the portal. Please be patient while this process occurs. Access to portal will not be necessary until the reports are published in June.

#### **School Photos**

Class, Individual, School Leaders and School House Captains photographs will take place on Friday 10 March 2023.

Students have received photograph order envelopes and information regarding the photographs is listed on the envelope. These envelopes are to be returned to your class teacher on or before **Friday 10 March 2023.** Every student is photographed whether they are purchasing or not. Envelopes need to be returned even if you do not wish to purchase.

Please refer to the information on the envelope regarding late orders. This fee is charged by the **School Photographer** and not Woollahra Public School. Should you require a sibling photo please collect the 'special' envelope from the school office, next week.

We ask that students wear their correct summer uniform including black shoes, navy socks and blue hair accessories. *Please do not include any other payments with your photograph envelope, these envelopes are not opened by the school and are given directly to the photographer.*

## Year 6-7 Transition – Applying for 2024 High School Placement

To enrol your child in Year 7 for 2024, you will need to complete an Expression of Interest for Year 6 to Year 7 transition. The Expression of Interest (EOI) lets you indicate which school(s) you would like your child to attend in Year 7.

The EOI process is now available online. After you submit an EOI and it has been assessed, your child will be offered a place at a high school.

If your child will not be attending a NSW Government high school next year, please let us know by completing a Placement Not Required (PNR) form. If you are unsure whether they will be attending a NSW Government school (you've applied for a private school, or you are moving interstate), we ask that you still complete an EOI and follow up with your school once a decision has been made.

The online process will guide you through your options and collect the information required to make the process as smooth as possible.

For parents/carers who are not able to complete an application online, a paper EOI form can be collected from the school office.

#### National Assessment Program Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) 2023

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is a point in time assessment of literacy and numeracy skills. Students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 participate in the annual tests in writing, reading, conventions of language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy. All NSW schools will sit NAPLAN online in 2023. NAPLAN is an important diagnostic assessment that gives us a snapshot of your child's learning in literacy and numeracy. It is one of a range of assessments that provide us with information to plan your child's learning program and develop their learning goals. Our school will be participating in NAPLAN between **15 and 27 March 2023**.

The attached information sheet gives you detailed information regarding the assessment and how it will work. We ask that all parents read it carefully. Don't hesitate to contact the school should you have any questions.

**Digital Devices and Headphones**: all assessments with the exception of Year 3 writing are conducted online. School computer devices that have specially been set up will be used for this purpose. Each child will need a set of headphones for the assessment. The school will provide these where needed. However, children often prefer to bring their own headphones. If this is the case, you might like to ensure your child has a functioning set of headphones or purchase some soon.

## Expression of Interest – General Assistant Temporary Position

Woollahra Public School, located in the Eastern suburbs of Sydney has an enrolment of 715 students. The school is located on a 0.7 hectare site in the middle of the city. The site holds several beautiful heritage buildings and some newer buildings. The grounds are asphalt and artificial grass with small gardens around the school. The school community takes an enormous amount of pride in our physical environment ensuring it is well maintained, clean and visually appealing. There are 28 classes and a range of other rooms which are used as learning spaces and offices. There is a dedicated space for the General Assistant to complete computer-based work and store equipment. The successful applicant will be part of a highly collaborative staff who support each other and work together with the goal of ensuring our school is the best it can be in every aspect of operation. Our school community prides itself on our values of inclusivity, caring, kindness and collaboration.

Expressions of interest are invited from people interested in working at our school in the position of General Assistant. The position includes a range of duties relating to routine maintenance and upkeep of the grounds at the school. Tasks are varied but include the following:

- Undertake minor maintenance of buildings and equipment that may not be covered by contractors or require a qualified tradesperson.
- Identify and report maintenance/safety issues to the Department of education contractors. Communicate with contractors and oversee maintenance work being conducted in the school.
- Organising, rooms, furniture and equipment within the school.
- Maintaining and caring for the school grounds including looking after gardens, watering and mulching.
- Unpacking, sorting and distributing stores.
- Storage and monitoring of tools, equipment and other stock for the General Assistant's use.
- Overseeing and monitoring school security and gate access for contractors.
- Assisting with set up for school events and special activities.
- Monitoring the safety of the school site and assisting with implementation of Work, Health and Safety policy.

#### Essential Requirements:

- Current Working with Children Check clearance (for paid employment).
- Willingness to complete all required Department of Education mandatory training.
- Strong interpersonal skills, flexibility, initiative and willingness to work in a wonderful school.

#### Position Details:

- The position is full time (5 days per week) although applicants wishing to work part time will be considered.
- Hours are 7.00am 3.00pm. There is a possibility of negotiation with these times.
- We are looking to fill the position as soon as possible until the end of 2023 with the possibility of extension. For the right applicant, a temporary contract will be put in place to enable leave entitlements to be accessed.


