National Assessment Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN)

This week has seen the commencement of the National Assessment Program Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) for Year 3, 5, 7 and 9 students across Australia. As with all schools, we are once again completing the assessments online. This is our fifth year working online. Over this week and next week our students will collectively complete 960 tests. This is no small task to prepare for and implement. I would like to congratulate our school leadership team, Janelle Warhurst, Judy Fetherston and Vanessa Kazanis who have led the implementation. Our teachers who have done a brilliant job preparing and supporting the Year 3 and 5 children.

The NAPLAN tests provide us with useful assessment information about each child's learning and are one source of information to inform their next steps in learning. We value and use this information. Just as importantly, we value all of the other ways in which we know your children well and personalise their learning. This includes daily conversations, observations of learning in the classrooms and the many school-based assessments we complete. In addition, each student's learning growth is so much more than can be measured in an assessment and this is something we celebrate. To see each learner growing their strengths of curiosity, collaboration, critical thinking, personal best, compassion, kindness, empathy, resilience and perseverance is equally important to us as educators. These qualities will never be measured in an assessment and I encourage you to celebrate your child's growth in these domains as much as their assessment achievements. The NAPLAN assessments continue until the end of next week. Please don't hesitate to contact us if you have any questions.

Learning Conferences

As part of the reporting process to parents we will be holding learning conferences for all students in weeks 10 and 11 of Term 1.

- *All students K-6 will be part of the conference with their parent/s and teacher. The focus will be on discussing the student's strengths, successes and areas for growth.*
- *You will be part of a conference with your child to discuss some samples of work, goal setting and action plans. There will be a focus on the child being at the centre of the discussion so that they can have input and be part of establishing their learning goals. This is important in enabling each of our students to take ownership of their own learning and be a self-directed learner.*
- *There will also be an opportunity for you to share information about your child with the teacher that they may not already be aware of.*

Learning conferences will be 10 - 15 minutes in length. They will commence on **Monday 27 March** and conclude on **Wednesday 5 April 2022**.

This year we are once again using an online booking system called **School Interviews**. This system allows you to log in using a unique school code, select your child's teacher and choose from the available times. The system can be accessed at:

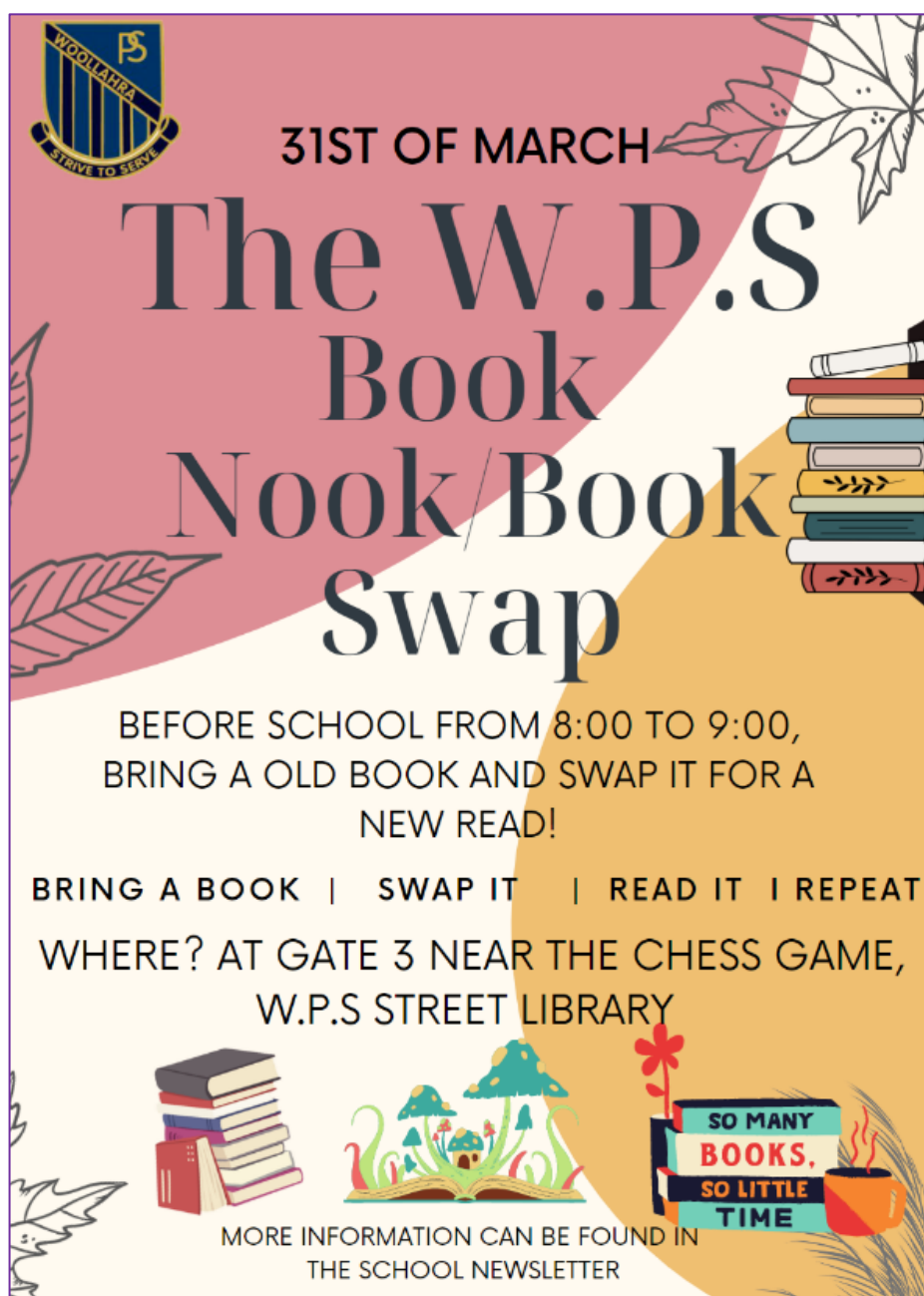


The Grand Woollahra Book Swap and Book Nook Opening!

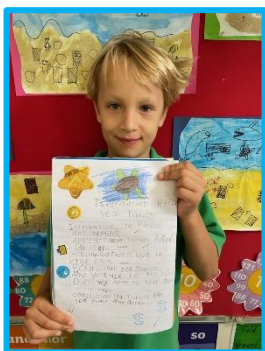

Learning in 2K and 2J with Ms Konstantaras and Ms Jankelson



2K and 2J have been thoroughly enjoying our Literacy learning. We have been exploring context, representation, and perspective within our reading and writing lessons using quality literature. We are further exploring these ideas within our art and drama and other multimedia tools!

This term, we have been planning, writing and editing informative texts using the new K-2 English Curriculum. We have been learning to understand the elements of informative texts, and the difference between fact, fiction and opinion. For the last few weeks, we have dug deeper into researching native animals,

turtles, rabbits and... even ibises which has brought out some very interesting facts! It has been fun learning the difference between narrative and informative and seeing different literature on the same topic. Using higher thinking skills, we are now asking some why or how questions to provoke and lead our research and inquiry. Next time you see a 2J or 2K student, we will happily tell you a fact from our information report research.

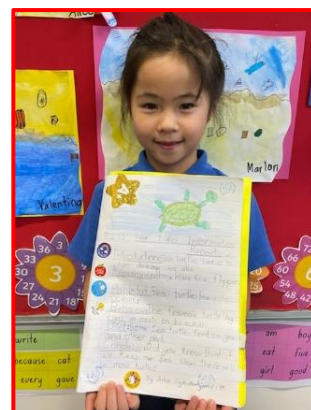

Year 6-7 Transition – Applying for 2024 High School Placement

To enrol your child in Year 7 for 2024, you will need to complete an Expression of Interest for Year 6 to Year 7 transition. The Expression of Interest (EOI) lets you indicate which school(s) you would like your child to attend in Year 7.

The EOI process is now available online. After you submit an EOI and it has been assessed, your child will be offered a place at a high school.

If your child will not be attending a NSW Government high school next year, please let us know by completing a Placement Not Required (PNR) form. If you are unsure whether they will be attending a NSW Government school (you've applied for a private school, or you are moving interstate), we ask that you still complete an EOI and follow up with your school once a decision has been made.

The online process will guide you through your options and collect the information required to make the process as smooth as possible. For parents/carers who are not able to complete an application online, a paper EOI form can be collected from the school office.

2023 New South Wales Premier's Reading Challenge

The NSW Premier's Reading Challenge (PRC) for 2023 commenced on Monday 27 February. The Challenge aims to encourage a love of reading in students and



to enable them to experience quality literature. It is not a competition but a challenge to each student to read more and read more widely.

The PRC is open to all NSW students from Kindergarten to Year 9 and does not close until Friday 19 August.

We encourage all students at Woollahra Public School to participate in the PRC and the library has a wide range of PRC books for students to borrow and enjoy reading.

At Woollahra K to 2 students have the books read to them in their classroom and students in Year 2 also read some independently. Years 3 to 6 students are encouraged to borrow PRC books regularly and read them independently.

Students then record them on their personal log sheet. During Term 3 we have sessions in the library and classroom to record them on the PRC personal site page.

Students in K-2 must have heard or read 30 PRC Books (25 PRC books and 5 free choice) and Years 3-6 students need to read 20 books (15 PRC books and 5 free choice).

We have an extensive range of Premiers Reading Challenge selected books in the library and I have been very impressed with the number of eager students eager in participating so far.

Being of Benefit to Others

Türkiye and Syria Earthquake Relief

Two earthquakes, the first a 7.7 magnitude followed by a 7.6 magnitude earthquake, struck Türkiye and Syria on 6 February 2023. A third earthquake of 6.4 magnitude has hit Türkiye, only weeks after the first two earthquakes.

The collective death toll is now more than 47,000. While the total number of children affected remains unclear, 4.6 million children live in the 10 provinces of Türkiye hit by the earthquakes, and more than 2.5 million children are affected in Syria. Families have been displaced, exposing them to the elements at a time of year when temperatures regularly drop below freezing.



The earthquakes have also caused widespread damage to schools and other essential infrastructure, further jeopardizing the well-being of children and families. Access to safe water and sanitation is also a major concern, as are the health needs of the affected population.

By making a donation, you'll be helping children and their families impacted by the earthquake in Türkiye and Syria.
