Mother's Day Celebrations – Friday 12 May



Whole School News Dogs on our School Site

For many members of our school community, dogs are an important part of our lives. We do have to remember however, that this is not the case for all of our students and their families. We have some students that are quite fearful of dogs. In addition, even the most placid dog can be unpredictable in an environment such as a school playground or on the streets around the school. We recently had an incident where an unleashed dog was brought onto the school grounds in the afternoon while afternoon sports activities were concluding. This caused a great deal of distress and fear for some of our children.

Please remember that dogs are not to be brought onto our school site at anytime – leashed or unleashed. They are also not to be tied up outside the school grounds.

A reminder that this is law under the NSW Companion Animals Act as follows:

Dogs are prohibited in the following places (whether or not they are leashed or otherwise controlled)--

- (a) Children's play areas (meaning any public place, or part of a public place that is within 10 metres of any playing apparatus provided in that public place or part for the use of children).
- (e) School grounds (meaning any property occupied or used for a purpose connected with the conduct of a government school or non- government school under the <u>Education Act 1990</u>, other than any property used for a residence or the curtilage of a residence).

While only a small percentage of dogs will ever be involved in an attack, the <u>Companion Animals Act 1998</u> ('the Act') requires that all dogs must be under effective control by means of a chain, cord or leash when in public (unless in a designated off-leash area) in order to minimise the chances of an attack occurring, and to protect the welfare of the dog and members of the public. While it is imperative that we all abide by the law, it's just as important that we support each other as a community. Our school grounds need to be a safe place for every child and family. This means it is not a place for dogs.

Uniform Reminders

Woollahra is a proud uniform wearing school. A couple of reminders regarding our uniform:

- Please ensure your child is wearing Woollahra uniform items and not alternate jumpers and hats.
- 'Woollahra Wildcats' jumpers are not part of our school uniform and are not to be worn to school. These
- need to be saved for wearing on the weekend at sport.
- Black shoes are an important part of our uniform every day unless your child is wearing sports uniform.
- We have a 'no hat, no play' policy and require every child to wear a school hat when outside. This includes before and after school.

We appreciate the support of all families in adhering to these uniform guidelines.

As the weather starts to become colder, we are increasingly dealing with the challenge of tracking down jumpers and jackets when they are taken



off at school. It is very frustrating when expensive clothing is lost or we are unable to return jackets to the owners as they do not have names on them. Let's work together as a whole school to do the following:

- Label every piece of your child's school uniform clearly with their name especially hats and jackets.
- Remind your child about the importance of putting their clothing in their bag if they take it off.
- If your child comes home with an item of clothing which does not belong to them, please return it to school with a note so that it can be returned to its rightful owner.

School Opal Card Compliance

We have received the following information from Transdev, the school bus operator. Please discuss with your child the need for tapping on and off.

It is essential for all school students to travel with a valid School Opal Card or Child/Youth Opal Card. This is so that we can understand customer travel patterns and can adjust the services provided, if necessary. Every time a student Taps On and Off, students are counted on our service — when students do not, they are invisible. Without accurate patronage data, Transport for NSW has the option to withdraw services that show low patronage. Further, adopting the behaviours of Tapping On and Off is a key part of fare compliance. Once students are no longer travelling to and from school, it is a legal requirement to travel with a valid ticket.

We ask that all parents ensure that their children have a valid Opal card for travelling to and from school each day. We also ask that you please encourage them to Tap On and Off every time they use a bus service. To be eligible for a School Opal Card the student must:

- be a resident of NSW, or an overseas student eligible for free government education.
- be aged 4 years 6 months or older. Pre-school children are not eligible.
- live a minimum distance from your school: o Years K-2 (Infants) No minimum distance. o Years 3-6 (Primary) 1.6km straight line distance or 2.3km walking or further. o Years 7-12 (Secondary) 2km straight line distance or 2.9km walking or further. If you do not meet these criteria, your child will need to carry a Child/Youth Opal card with funds loaded onto it. *Transdev John Holland Buses (NSW) Pty Ltd www.transdevjohnholland.com.au*

Message for Year 4 Parents - placement in an opportunity class in 2024

Opportunity classes are for primary school students who have high academic potential or who are intellectually gifted. They provide an environment where students can learn and make friends with classmates of similar ability. This can benefit a student's academic progress and also their wellbeing.

Opportunity classes are offered in Years 5 and 6, with parents/carers applying in Year 4. Students who are successfully placed will usually have to leave their current school to enrol in a school with an opportunity class for Years 5 and 6.

Opportunity classes are just one of the ways that we cater for our high potential and gifted students.

Testing and assessment

Applications for opportunity class placement are considered on the results of the Opportunity Class Placement Test. Students who wish to be considered for placement are required to sit the Opportunity Class Placement Test on Thursday 27 July 2023.

How to apply

Parents/carers must apply online between Thursday 30 March and Monday 15 May 2023 at:

You must use your own email address and not one belonging to your child. Late applications are not usually accepted. If you do not have internet access you can apply at a public library or at your child's school. If you have a disability that prevents you from using a computer, you can contact the Unit for assistance after 30 March 2023. You must submit only ONE application for each student.

Positive Behaviour for Learning

This term we are continuing our implementation of **Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL)**, a framework to create a positive, safe and supportive learning environment at Woollahra Public School.

Our three school PBL expectations are:

- Be Respectful
- Be Safe
- Be an Active Learner

These expectations underpin everything we do at WPS in learning spaces, the playground, going to the library, at assembly, on excursions, at school sport – the PBL expectations are explicit and consistent, and remind students to make good choices in every part of their learning.

Each week our school has a key focus that teachers explore with their class, to ensure students have a clear understanding of the role they play in meeting our PBL expectations.

In Week 2 teachers will be revising the key expectations in the classroom:

Be Respectful	 Follow adult instructions Treat others the way you want to be treated Keep hands and feet to yourself Be proud of your area and environment Be an upstander, not a bystander
Be Safe	 Think about consequences before you act Report any problems to the teacher Use 'No, Go, Tell' strategy when feeling unsafe
Be an Active Learner	- Demonstrate a growth mindset in all activities

Thank you for your support of PBL by going through these expectations with your children.

Our opening hours in 2023 are Tuesday and Friday mornings between 8:30 and 9.00am.


Starting in 2023, second hand clothing will only be available for sale on the last Friday of Terms 1, 2 and 3. This is subject to availability of stock.
