#### Somewhere Over the Rainbow...musings on what makes a great school experience

Whenever anyone has a conversation with me about learning and school education, I'm always quick to describe teaching as both an art and a science. It's a highly complex endeavour and while it's one that as professional educators we adore. Designing learning experiences and creating educational environments that deeply engage our students and simultaneously maximise their learning, is intricate, challenging and at times a changing landscape. Education is also a landscape that is influenced from all directions ranging from current research and systemic policy through to personal opinion and the 'on the ground' experience of our teachers and children. I love this complexity and enjoy engaging in the debate, listening to the various perspectives and reflecting on what is best for our children at Woollahra. Our staff have regular conversations in this space. It's a point of pondering and thinking for me constantly and I feel uplifted when I have these conversations with parents. To this end, I thought I would share this insightful and reflective article published last year in the Griffith Review. It's written by an outstanding young woman and provides immense food for thought in thinking about what she describes as the 'tension between quantifying learning and quality learning'. We know that assessment of student learning and analysis of this assessment to determine our impact as educators is important. However, is it at the expense of making the learning experience for our kids more about measuring their progress and less about what will matter to them long after the assessment is over? The relationships our kids have at school, how we challenge them to approach their learning with curiosity, creativity and a mindset that values learning for what it brings us in our lives are perhaps the things that matter over learning as a means to achieve on a test. I would love to know your thoughts and urge us all to reflect on this and talk about what we value in learning at Woollahra.

# We are excited to announce our school will be transitioning to an upgraded School Bytes finance system on 23 May 2023!

In preparation for the transition to a simplified finance system for both you and the school, we will be required to implement a short payment lockout period where we will not be able to receive any payments.

#### What this means for you

- No payments can be made online from 9am, <u>Tuesday 16 May 2023</u>.
- Last day to make cash, cheque or EFTPOS payments will be close of business on Tuesday 16 May 2023.
- We will advise you when payments can resume soon.
- Any existing payment links that have been sent to you previously in emails can still be used after the transition and will automatically redirect to the new system.
- After the transition, a School Bytes portal will be available for you to register and begin using (Link: https://portal.schoolbytes.education).
- All previous payments made will be migrated to the new School Bytes finance system and portal.

### What is the School Bytes portal

The School Bytes portal provides flexibility for you to conveniently:

- Make school payments online (including paying for multiple siblings at once)
- Use a family credit to pay for an activity or school contributions
- Download a receipt for payments made
- View all historical payments in one place
- Complete and submit digital permission notes
- View the status of all permission notes
- Request a refund if required

This can be done where you want at any time: day or night.

Through the portal, you will easily be able to download a receipt once a payment has been made and have access to view all historical payments when needed. Online payments are processed in real-time and can be viewed by school staff immediately. While our preference is for payments to be made via the portal, we will still accept payment via cash, cheque, and money order.

#### 2024 Enrolments

Do you have a child who turns five years of age before 31 July 2024 and will be ready to start school? We encourage all families with children starting school next year to complete the enrolment application. Please also spread the word to other local families interested in enrolling at our school that now is the time to work through this process.
