## Osborne Lane Pick Up

We are continually working to ensure efficient and safe pick-up procedures for your children. Of significant concern are the safety issues at the gate on Osborne Lane. This gate is not to be used as a pedestrian entry and exit due to the safety concerns with traffic and visibility. Please ensure you adhere to the following procedures:

- ***All pedestrians to use the Forth Street gates. Crossing the road at the Osborne gate is not safe with so many cars coming through. We appreciate your cooperation with this.***

- *Ensure you have talked to your children and reminded them to be lined up on the soccer field near the gate as soon as they leave class at 3pm. The teachers are also working on this to make sure your children are at the gate as soon as you pull up.*
- *Please do not park in the lane and get out of your car. This causes congestion problems in the lane and makes it unsafe.*
- *We are able to fit two cars at the gate if the first car moves up as far as possible. This way two children can be picked up at once allowing the line to move faster.*
- *Please ensure you do not queue along Edgecliff Road waiting to turn into Osborne Lane. If you are unable to turn into the lane, please drive around the block and come back.*

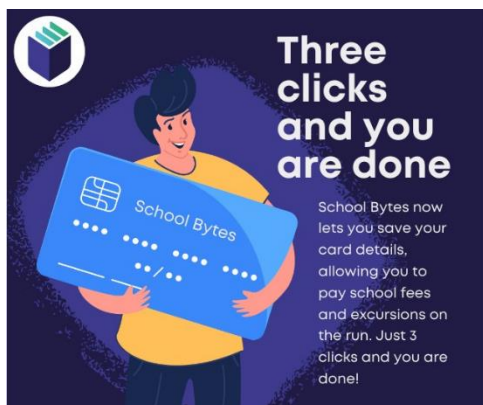

- made bush soap using the 'golden wattle' leaves
- investigated the cotton farming industry
- used solar extraction techniques to create plant based dyes

Throughout the term we have had a group of hard working Stage 3 students preparing for and competing in the Tournament of Minds competition. A collaborative problem solving program focused on creative and critical thinking, Tournament of Minds is a high calibre international event which attracts some of the best minds from around the country. This year over 570 teams in NSW competed in the Tournament of Minds competition. Last week's newsletter had a showcase of each team and their work to date. All of our teams performed brilliantly at the regional finals recently with the Social Sciences and Language and Literature teams progressing to and competing in the state finals on Sunday. Both teams that competed at the state competition produced truly inspirational responses to complex tasks and the Language and

Literature team were awarded first place!

The students had three hours to prepare their response to the challenge presented to them at the state final. Our children expanded their creative and divergent thinking skills as they worked to negotiate ideas and solutions amongst a team of seven! All responses were entirely the student's own work with students in each team writing their own script, making their own props and costumes and sound effects.

We are immensely proud of the effort and commitment all teams applied to solving challenges throughout the Tournament of Minds competition. We wish the Language and Literature team all the best as they represent NSW at the international finals to be held in Melbourne in October. We extend special thanks to Ms Hayward for her mentorship and special thanks to our very supportive parent team.

## **Whole School News**

### **Supervision Before and After School**

The safety of all of our students is paramount at all times. This includes before and after school. Please be reminded that **teacher supervision in the playground starts at 8.30am each morning**. No child is permitted to be at school before this time. We have had a number of children arriving at school early and remaining unsupervised in the playground. *Helping Hands* OOSHC Service run an excellent before school care program from 7.00am each morning. We ask that you make use of this service if need be. In the afternoons we ask that all children leave the playground at 3.10pm and do not remain to play unsupervised. Again, there is no teacher supervision after school (that's when we hold our staff, learning support and professional learning meetings). The playground is also used for the aftercare service and it is important children not attending the service leave the grounds. Finally, **no child is to play on the playground equipment in the Chisholm and Barton playgrounds before and after school**. This rule is in place even when there is a teacher on duty. Please ensure your children stay off the equipment for safety reasons. It can be used during the day when there are fewer children in the playground.
